From Sleepless Nights to Warmth and Safety

Crystal is a single mom with two children, Uziel 6 years old and Aleyah 7 years old. They had been living in their car for three months when Monarch Services recommended, she call us. During those long nights, she stayed awake and alert watching her children sleep in case trouble approached. Sometimes she would take the children to their paternal grandma's house. It was somewhere safe for them to sleep, but she could not sleep there. On those nights, she slept in the car alone.

Everything changed on the day they moved into the Family Emergency Shelter. Crystal picked her children up from school and surprised them by driving to the Shelter and moving in. They were so happy.

"I cried that first night because living in the Shelter meant that I would be able to cook meals for my children."



For Crystal, being in the Shelter meant safety, stability, and the reassurance that her children wouldn't be hungry. Her favorite part of living in the Shelter was when it was her turn to cook dinner for the other families.

Within two months, Crystal secured a job with FedEx that included health benefits for her and her children. She was making progress towards her goals!

Within five months, she applied and was accepted into the 1-year Transitional Housing program. They've been there a month now and the children like having their own room.

Crystal has been motivated to go back to school. With support from her case manager, she's started a GED program and will graduate before Christmas. She plans to continue with school and become a pharmacy technician.

Bold Steps Forward

We recently sat down with a family who felt strongly about sharing their story but also needed to remain anonymous.

This family's living situation prior to coming to PVSS was unhealthy and scary. A relative living in their home was mentally unstable and often lashed out making it unsafe for the mother and her two small children. To make matters worse, she and her partner did not agree on how to discipline the children. His responses bordered on abusive. This mother was scared to leave but she knew she couldn't stay.

With encouragement and support from a trusted friend, she found the courage to leave. She remembers being scared and worried in those first few weeks. How would her partner react when he realized she wasn't returning home? Could she really make it without him?

As she came to know the other moms, it became clear she wasn't alone. The Shelter was full of other moms experiencing similar issues. The family settled in and the children made friends. The structure was challenging but also offered comfort and stability, making it easier.

"I felt comfortable, I felt like I had support. No matter what was going on I had a support system — Woman Power!"

She is resilient and determined to make a better life for her children. She was working, going to school, and attending case management meetings and workshops.



Worry and stress consumed her. The harder she tried the more stressed she became. The anxiety took its toll, and she fell ill for several weeks. At first, she saw the workshops as another task, another burden, but then she started listening and taking in the information being offered. With her case manager's encouragement, this mom embraced the workshops as a time to focus on her own growth and well-being.

In late summer, they moved into one-year transitional housing.

"My daughter cried when we moved out of the Shelter. We have happy memories there."

This mother demonstrates fortitude and continues to work, save money and go to college. She will be completing her degree at Cabrillo this May and is well on her way to a brighter future.

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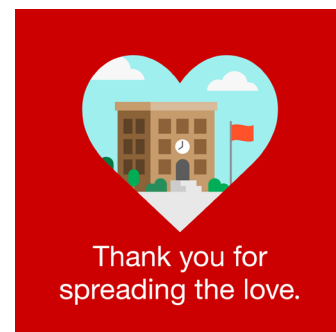


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Exciting News!
